| <p>12. Pinot Noir Reserva, Nostros – Chile. Soft, light red wine with mature red fruit, cherries, violet flowers and extremely delicate smoky nuances. Subtle, elegant and refined, its light tannins allow the fruit to dominate and its refreshing, persistent, delicate flavours to shine.</p> | <p>175ml

| <p>13. Cabernet Sauvignon, The Pugilist – Australia. The nose shows an array of perfumed characters such as violets, oregano & thyme, along with glacé cherry aromas. Sweet ripe cherry fruit dominates the front palate which then develops into a more savoury wine, showing earthiness, toasted spices and lovely dried herb characters.</p> | | | <p>£25.50</p> |
| <p>14. Duas Quintas Tinto - Portugal. From the upper Douro Valley the grapes are hand harvested before being gently pressed. The resulting wine is soft and intensely fruity with gentle tannins and rich dark fruit flavours.</p> | | | <p>£29.50</p> |
| <p>15. Rioja Reserva, Cerro Anon – Spain. A medium-full weight Rioja, with really deep, juicy Tempranillo fruit flavours, soft tannins and subtle hints of vanilla and spice. A satisfying and well-balanced red</p> | | | <p>£32.00</p> |
| <p>16. Chateau Vieux Peyrouquet, Bordeaux – France. Hailing from Saint-Emillion within the Iconic Bordeaux region, this wine has a gentle power. Subtle tannins backed with intense dark fruit are accompanied by cigar box aromas owing to the oak aging. A perfect all-rounder.</p> | | | <p>£35.00</p> |

The Rosé

17. **Zinfandel Rosé, Discovery Beach – USA.** After the Zinfandel grapes are harvested, a “cap and drain” method is used which allows the wine to be in contact with the skins for 6 hours before pressing. It gives the wine a darker colour as well as extracting a greater amount of fruit flavours which is evident in the ripe watermelon, strawberry and cherry that is experienced on the palate. This wine has a balance of floral character, sweetness and crisp acidity.

18. **Pinot Grigio Blush, Villa Benizi– Italy.** With a pale tinge of pink, this delicate rosé has aromas of wild strawberry, apple and honeysuckle. Crisp and fresh on the palate this wine offers a drier style but retains a wonderful fruitiness.
